A strong sense of mission and solidarity runs through all the schools in the province. Students work to raise awareness of care for Creation, and the needs of the poor. They dedicate their parties and the celebration of their patron saints to mission work. At each school, students put together missionary campaigns to raise funds for Paraguay and the most needy missions.

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
