Cluny Sisters in India Found a New Mission in Sri Lanka

S ister Rosary Chinappan, Provincial of South India, recently announced our first foundation in Sri Lanka.

Sister Elsa Puthussery and Sister Pakia Mary Salette, arrived on June 10, 2019 in the parish of Mandaithivu-Allaipiddi in the Diocese of Jaffna. They will collaborate with the de Montfort Brothers in an education project. They will also engage in pastoral and social ministry in the parish, which has a sub-station of 250 families. A third sister will join them later this year.

The long drawn out civil war lasting 30 years has left its mark. The people yearn for peaceful development, and they see education based on sound values as the foundation necessary to build a better future.

B lessed Anne Marie Javouhey sent sisters out to missions around the world, but her desire was that all her sisters would be united in one Cluny family. "May you always be of one heart and one spirit", she wrote. So, while our *Rule of Life* calls us to be ready to leave our community, province or country in response to the call of our mission, we are also called to collaborate and support one another across the province boundaries. Many of you have met sisters from the Province of West Africa (Sierra Leone, The Gambia, and Ghana) when we welcome a sister from the province and facilitate her travel to the parishes assigned for the annual Mission Cooperative Program.

This year, at the request of Sister Catherine Jarra and her leadership council, we collaborated in a new way. I responded to their request to spend a few weeks in the province to lead a retreat and several workshops in each of the countries of the province. I also conducted workshops with other sisters, laypersons, priests, catechists and seminarians, and was interviewed on radio and TV.

It was not "all work and no play" as I was able to visit the sisters in their various communities and ministries. It was a privilege and a true joy to be with our sisters in each of their countries, getting to know them, their people and their many ministries. For me it was a great gift and a learning experience.



Workshop: Successful Change Agents for Today's World – Sisters honing and applying skills and tools to respond to specific instances of injustice and local needs. Each community identified a specific issue and developed a plan of action that will be completed over a period of two to three months. Each community will present its project evaluation during the annual general meeting in August.

Workshop: Faith Development, Evangelization and Small Christian Communities – Sharing faith on the scriptures in community, and evangelizing by founding and supporting small Christian communities in parishes.

Blessing and Inauguration of New Nava Jeevan **School Building** for Special Needs Children

une 6, 2019 was a red letter day in the history of the community of St. Joseph, Karaikal as Nava Jeevan, a school for special children, was inaugurated and blessed. Not able to get a suitable place for the school, the sisters moved it from place to place and house to house, but managed to run the school for the past 13 years. This year, the community was able to purchase a beautiful building with the help of the province, and to convert it into a spacious and well equipped school for special children, the new poor of our locality. Today over 50 children are benefitting from our service.

The school was inaugurated by Sister Rosita, our Provincial, cutting the ribbon and invoking the presence of Christ by lighting the Kuthuvilakku (brass oil lamp). The parish priest Father Antony Raj blessed the house and celebrated Mass to bring down God's blessings on the school. The presence of a few members of the Provincial Council, sisters from Pondicherry and neighboring communities, staff, students and parents of Nava Jeevan, and well-wishers added solemnity to the function. Congratulations and best wishes to Sister Daisy, the Director, the staff, and students of Nava Jeevan.

Yet even in death, we continue to be enriched by the memories of Joe's witness to his faith, outreach to those in need, and love of all those he met.
